# **SDS FIGHTS HARVARD'S ATTEMPT TO STOP SDS NATIONAL CONVENTION AGAINST RACISM**

## **HARVARD GIVES IN HALF WAY! SDS DEMANDS 4 FULL DAYS!**



The response to the SDS National Convention against Racism has been very enthusiastic. Hundreds and hundreds of students, teachers, campus workers and others will be arriving in Boston on March 30 determined to map out a strategy to defeat racism thru the unity of workers and students. In the face of the terrific response to the Convention, the Harvard administration has sprung every double-crossing trick in the book to try to stop the Convention.

People have written for information about the SDS Nat'l Convention from all over the world. Japan, Sweden, England, Puerto Rico, Ireland and all over the U.S. are just some of the places we've received letters from. We just got a letter from a student in Monterrey, Mexico who wants to receive SDS lit and says he wishes he could be at Harvard on March 30 (we're working on making that a reality now). Students from the University of Western Toronto just had their first SDS meeting (see p. 3) and report that they're expecting to bring over 75 people to the Convention from all of Canada. Excerpts from *New Left Notes* are now being printed in French for students in Montreal. West Coast SDS is planning on bringing a plane load of people to the Convention. Everywhere SDS chapters and other groups attending are making the final plans for resolutions and workshops to be presented at the Convention. Everyone who has not made arrangements to come to the Convention yet, should get in touch with SDS in their area now. This Convention and the plans students make at it, will spell more than trouble for the racist, chauvinist and anti-worker forces in society.

The SDS National Convention will convene at Harvard on Thursday, March 30. Registration begins at 9:00 in the morning at the Phillips Brooks House, NW corner of the Harvard Yard. At this time the Harvard administration has backed down part-way. They issued SDS threats as to whether or not we would be allowed to have the Convention at all at Harvard, but then backed down to the point where, at this time, they issued us permits or Fri. at 3:00pm til Sun. at midnight. They are organizing all over Boston to stop the first two days of the Convention.

We've asked for rooms at other Boston area schools. A dean at MIT told SDS, "Epps (Dean of Students at Harvard) told me not to give SDS rooms." Brandeis told SDS we could have rooms for the Convention for \$4,000. We said, okay, we'll pay. They said, sorry, we don't want you. At Northeastern U. a dean told us he'd try anything in his power to keep the SDS Convention from happening there. And at Harvard, Dean Epps continues with the royal runaround about rooms for Thurs. and Fri.

First, it's there are no available rooms, then, it's that Harvard has a policy not to allow conventions to begin on schooldays, and now he says he does not know who at Harvard is in charge of granting rooms for Thurs. and Fri. All lies. Now (oddly enough, two weeks before the Convention) Harvard has had an SDS member arrested for trespassing and (along with the infamous Richard J. Herrnstein) has just pressed phony charges of harrassment against two SDS members. Harvard is proposing to "judge" these people in front of a panel that includes one of the administrators who pressed the charges in the first place!, and at a closed hearing, like the kind held during the Spanish Inquisition. Enough of this harrassment. Racism is the crux of the matter. Harvard is for racism and SDS has been fighting against racism harder than ever. That's why Harvard wants to stop the SDS National Convention against Racism, that's why they try people at closed hearings and arrest people who organize against racism for walking on their sacred property.

B) WE DO NEED SOME MORE ROOMS FOR THURS. AND FRI. IF HARVARD DOESN'T BACK DOWN ALL THE WAY, BUT THERE ARE A LOT OF HARVARD STUDENTS WHO HAVE VOLUNTEERED THEIR BIG LIVING ROOM TYPE ROOMS IN THE DORMS. THESE WILL BE FINE IF WE CAN'T GET THE CLASSROOMS. REMEMBER... REGISTRATION STARTS AT 9:00 AM ON THURSDAY, MARCH 30 AT THE PHILLIPS BROOKS HOUSE, NW CORNER OF THE HARVARD YARD (REGISTRATION WILL CONTINUE ALL DAY AND NIGHT TIL 1:00 pm). PEOPLE CAN PICK UP DETAILED CONVENTION SCHEDULES THERE, MAPS OF HARVARD AND CAMBRIDGE AND HOUSING.

Come to the SDS National Convention against Racism, as the hundreds of people who have responded to us are, bring all your friends and help plan a strategy that can stop racism and all anti-worker attacks cold.

He decided to leave for good when welfare mothers started yelling at him when he said people on welfare should be sterilized because they have too many kids. ## The SDS Convention

THE ADMINISTRATION'S consideration of SDS's request for rooms for its National Convention Against Racism has been marked by politically motivated intransigence. Every conceivable objection to the convention, including past debts, attendance limitations, and the convention's publicity, has been raised by the Administration.

The most pernicious argument brought up by the Administration was Dean Dunlop's threat that continuation of protests against Richard J. Herrnstein, professor of Psychology, might mean a denial of a convention permit. The use of the University's administrative functions for blackmailing a group into changing policies is a precedent with dangerous ramifications. To be consistent with its own pronouncements, the Administration should be able to enforce its rules with the apparatus it has set up to do so: the Committee on Rights and Responsibilities. Happily, the Administration has let the threat lie, without further mention or efforts to enforce it.

Unhappily however, the MIT administration, pursuing the same tortuous logic, has ruled SDS "inappropriate to host a national convention" on the basis of "its demonstrated attitude toward the foundations of the university and its underlying principles of free speech and individual integrity," according to Louis Menard III, assistant to the provost of MIT. By arbitrarily depriving the MIT chapter of SDS of its freedom to speak in a public forum with other SDS chapters, the MIT administration has placed political considerations above its own belief in free speech.

MIT'S DECISION eliminated the best alternative location for SDS to hold its meetings on the first two days of the convention. Harvard has denied it a permit on these days because classes will then be in session. The problem with having the convention while classes are in session is not a lack of rooms. Dean Epps said that the reason for denying the request for rooms on those days is a long-established, but unwritten, Faculty rule that a convention can not be held while classes are in session. This rule is necessarily arbitrary because it does not define what constitutes a convention. And its enforcement has been selective—as recently as last Thursday a model United Nations was permitted to convene here. That this unwritten rule is being used against SDS makes it appear that political considerations underlie its enforcement.

We hope that the Administration will reconsider its refusal to grant permission for SDS to hold the first two days of the convention here and in the future not allow political considerations to enter into the approval of requests for the use of campus facilities.

As Harvard tries to stop the SDS National Convention for Thurs. and Fri., a lot of different organizations and individuals are backing up SDS. As we go to press, only a few days after Harvard has launched their attack, Harvard/Radcliffe Raza, NAM, students, faculty members and many other groups or individuals have come out to demand that SDS get rooms for the full four days of the Convention. Many other organizations are meeting this week to consider the same. Send a telegram yourself to Dean of Students, Archie Epps, Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. (with a copy to SDS) protesting Harvard's refusal to give SDS Convention space. Come to the Convention!!!

## Boston Area Faculty Condemn Harvard

A letter sent by Dean Epps to Miss Katherine Moos, Vice-President of Harvard-Radcliffe S.D.S., makes it clear that Harvard may use its disapproval of the campaign against Herrnstein as a reason for denying facilities for the S.D.S. National Convention against Racism. In our opinion, and, we feel sure, that of many other faculty members as well, such an action would be an ominous act of political repression, and one without precedent in Harvard's history, as far as we know. Nor do the other reasons mentioned in Dean Epps' letter (that students are still on campus the two days before Easter weekend, etc.) do anything to alleviate our anxiety. It is excellent that the student movement is beginning to concentrate on the issue of racism, and we feel that failure on the part of the Harvard administration to grant permission to have the S.D.S. Convention against Racism, March 30 through April 2, would be a further example of unresponsiveness on the question of racism, as well as a dangerous precedent in the direction of a new McCarthyism.

# HOUSTON: Workers and Students Break Up Lobotomy Conference

We opposed the implication that "violent and aggressive behavior" is due to a malfunctioning of the brain and we also opposed their suggestion that it is controlled (e.g., psycho-surgery). We believe that unless it is stopped, psycho-surgery will be used against black, latin and white working people who are fighting back against tremendous injustices in society. It will be used to stop future Atticas, it will be used to rob the working class of some of its most militant leaders. Already there are cases of psycho-surgery being used to pacify prisoners in Calif.

On Sat., March 11, members of Houston SDS stormed the door of the Houston Neurological Symposium. Doctors from all over the country were discussing the use of psycho-surgical technique to control people's "neural based aggressive and violent behavior." After some scuffling with police, the doctors let us in to their elitist meeting, (\$110 registration fee). A member of SDS read a resolution that called for the symposium to take a stand against racism and oppression by opposing the use of psycho-surgery. Doctors from the Medical Committee for Human Rights spoke at the symposium against the use of psycho-surgery in prisons. After we read the resolution, the chairman squelched a scheduled discussion by adjourning immediately. Nevertheless, we did succeed in making our position known to the doctors and to the larger Houston community via leaflets and substantial news coverage in the Houston media. People in other cities should watch for and oppose similar discussions and programs. Don't let psycho-surgery be instituted or defended anywhere.

## Prof's Letter to Crimson on Harvard's Racism

To the Editors of the *Crimson*:

The cloak of academic freedom in which so many in the Harvard community seek to conceal their real feelings in the continuing debate as to whether Professor Richard Herrnstein's writings on "I.Q." are racist, was inadvertently pierced last week by Psychology Department chairman, Edwin Newman. According to the March 10 *Crimson*, Newman refused to give a definite answer as to whether he personally thinks blacks are inferior because "all the facts aren't in."

Like most black people here, I have watched with detached interest as student groups like SDS and UAG evidence willingness to risk expulsion and possible prison in bold—and likely futile—efforts to convince the world (and perhaps themselves) that white Americans are not as insensitive to the centuries of white racist oppression as Herrnstein's writings suggest.

Among other things, these students fight ambition and tradition, two qualities hallowed at Harvard. Scholars, and particularly scientists, have served as the well-rewarded apologists for this country's racial policies ever since slavery days.

Typical of Harvard faculty in this group was Dr. Louis Agassiz who in 1863 wrote (obviously without the facts) that Negroes were "indolent, playful, sensual, imitative, subservient, good-natured, versatile, unsteady in their purpose, devoted and affectionate...nowhere do they appear to have been capable of rising by themselves, to the level of the civilized communities of the whites..."

That was over a century ago, but as the more sophisticated if no less odious writings of the Herrnsteins and Arthur Jensen show, the magnetic attraction of power, prestige, and profit, for justifying a nation's racial conduct, which is no less unjustifiable because stated in academic terms, remains irresistible.

Rational response is wasted here. And yet continued silence is impossible. All the facts may not be in on black inferiority, but there is a ghetto slang game that might assist the Herrnsteins, Jensens, and Newmans uncover the missing data. Simply stated gentlemen, why don't you ask your mothers?
