Last week the eleven top leaders of the Amorican Communist Party were convicted under the Smith Gag Act. There is no space with which to go into the intricactes of the law itself, although an examination of the Act, under which first Trotsky ists and then Stalinists were tried, is a real exposure in itself of our democratic processes.

The important thing is to recognize that the Stalinists' conviction is not merely one more abrogation of our civil liberties, but that it is a long step toward WAR. The government knows it must destroy the American Stalinists as an organization before shooting begins.
