Fourth. This decision, in itself, embodies and enacts an amendment to the constitution of the United States. Thus these nine men have usurped the supremest function of any government institution, the right to modify the fundamental law of a people. This function has heretofore been assumed to be vested in two-thirds of congress and three-fourths of the legislatures of all the states. Judge Harlan tells us that the court has accomplished the thing in merely deciding a law suit. And as was said in the preceding paragraph, Judge Harlan's diagnosis of the matter was not necessary to its easy discernment. The constitutional change is found in the conferring of direct legislative powers upon the judiciary—the self-clothing of this court by a function from which it is barred by the constitution. Here then is a legal precedent under which the court may enact as it sees fit and there is now no power to gainsay their authority. No more revolutionary constitutional amendment could be conceived than the one under discussion, and none more dangerous to democratic institutions. 





