## INDUSTRIAL DISEASES IN THE UNITED STATES

The failure of the national and state governments to protect workmen from preventable inseases of inclustry is strikingly brought out in a report just susued of the Serond National Conference on Industrial Diseases. It is shown that in three years the Illinois Commission found 578 cases of lead positioning in that State and that a hastly and incomplete study disclosed 121 cases of this one disease of occupation in New York City shone. Many of these were due to the absence of regulations requiring the use of simple protective devices and practices which, it is pointed out, are in general use in Germany and England under legislation providing for the payment of insurance benefits in the case of sickness directly due to industry.
