When it comes to competing it appears that the United States Government is a much better competitor than the individual concerns operated for profit. It shows that big business can be conducted by the people better and cheaper than by a private corporation.

One company which soid shares formerly at 175 could be bought for

The express companies are getting all the competition they want.
The same companies that paid such high dividends paid the poorest wages. Drivers and other employes received from forty to sixty
diollars a month for 12 to 14 hours a day, with some work on Sanday.
