EIGHT-HOUR LAW.

RIGHT-HOUR LAW.

Olympia, Wash.—W. H. Kingery, Secialist Representative in the Legislature, as filed an initiative bill with the Secretary of State here, to limit the house of work for mea and women to eight hours out of any twenty-four, and forty-eight hours during any week, excepting only agricultural labor, where an additional two fours per day is allowed.

The law is further to provide that in exceptional cases where work is required beyond the eight-hour limit, the overtime is to be paid at the rate of time and one-haff. Violation carries penalties from \$10 to \$100 per day.
